POLICIES

Attendance

At Goodpasture Christian School, we deeply value the commitment and dedication of our students to their fine arts pursuits, as they reflect the gifts and talents bestowed upon us by God. Our attendance policy for fine arts events and rehearsals is designed to foster excellence, teamwork, and a spirit of service. By participating fully and consistently, students uphold our Christian values while nurturing their artistic growth.

- 1. **Attendance Expectations:** All students participating in fine arts events, performances, and rehearsals are expected to attend consistently and punctually. Your presence contributes to the collaborative effort of creating impactful and inspiring artistic expressions.
- 2. Notification of Absence: If you are unable to attend a scheduled event or rehearsal due to unforeseen circumstances, illness, or family emergencies, please notify your director as soon as possible. Timely communication allows for adjustments and ensures the best possible outcome for the team.
- 3. No Call No Show: A "no call no show" occurs when a student does not attend an event or rehearsal without prior notice or explanation. This is considered a serious breach of the attendance policy, as it disrupts the ensemble's preparation and impacts the overall experience for everyone involved. Instances of "no call no show" may result in consequences such as loss of performance opportunities, reevaluation of roles or positions, and a potential impact on eligibility for future events. We believe that these consequences underscore the importance of communication and accountability.
- 4. Consistency and Progress: Regular attendance is essential for your growth as an artist and the cohesion of the ensemble. Consistent participation allows you to fully engage in the artistic process, develop your skills, and contribute to the collective progress of the group.
- 5. **Grace and Understanding:** We understand that circumstances may arise that prevent perfect attendance. However, we encourage open communication and a proactive approach to managing your schedule to minimize disruptions.

Social Media

Social media provides a powerful platform for sharing our artistic talents, connecting with the community, and upholding the values of Goodpasture Christian School. To ensure that our online presence reflects the standards of excellence, integrity, and Christian values we uphold, the following social media policy applies to all students, faculty, and staff associated with the Fine Arts Department:

Conduct

Consequences may include, but are not limited to:

DRESS CODE

The following dress code guidelines are designed to ensure a respectful and focused atmosphere during fine arts activities:

Band

- → Rehearsal Attire
 - ◆ Plain White T-Shirts/Tank Tops that are within the school dress code
 - ♦ Black, Navy Blue, Gray/Silver Shorts
 - ◆ Tennis Shoes that allow the ankle to move freely
- → Sporting Event Attire
 - **◆** Summer Uniform:
 - Black Goodpasture Polo
 - Khaki Shorts (Within Dress Code)
 - Black Socks
 - Black Marching Shoes
 - ◆ Marching Uniform:
 - Black Compression Short-Sleeve Shirts and Shorts (Form Fitting)
 - Long Black Socks
 - Black Marching Shoes
 - Bibbers
 - Tops
- → Concert Attire
 - ◆ Christmas Concert Attire
 - Tops
 - Black Long-Sleeve Tops
 - Bottoms
 - Black pants or skirt (no more than 4 inches above the knee)
 - Those wearing skirts must also wear black tights
 - Shoes

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- Accessories
 - Festive and Appropriate Ties/Jewelry
 - Those wearing skirts must also wear black tights
- ◆ Spring Concert/Concert Performance Assessment

Men

- Black Long Sleeve Dress Shirt
- Black Tie
- Black Suit/Tux Jacket
- Black Dress Pants (No Jean/Cargo)
- Black Belt
- Black Socks
- Black Dress Shoes (No Vans, Boots, etc.)

Women

- Black Dress (Must Be Within Dress Code)
- Black Tights
- Black Shoes
- Accessories are limited to earrings only (NO Necklaces, Rings)

Please note that hair for all events should be neatly styled or pulled back away from the face.

→ Other Out-Of-School Events:

- → At Goodpasture Christian School, we recognize that our students represent our values and principles not only within the school campus but also in various external settings. Our dress code reflects our commitment to honoring God, promoting modesty, and maintaining a respectful appearance in all circumstances. When attending events outside of school, please adhere to the following guidelines:
 - ◆ Modesty and Respect: Choose attire that is modest and respectful of yourself and others. Avoid clothing that is overly revealing, excessively casual, or inappropriate for the occasion.
 - ◆ Appropriate Fit and Length: Select clothing that fits well and is of an appropriate length. Dresses, skirts, and shorts should be of modest length, and pants should not be excessively tight.
 - ◆ Necklines and Sleeves: Opt for necklines and sleeves that provide adequate coverage. Avoid low necklines, strapless or spaghetti-strap tops, and sleeveless tops with overly wide armholes.
 - ◆ Avoid Distractions: Clothing with large logos, offensive language, graphics, or excessive embellishments should be avoided. The focus should be on your character and the purpose of the event.

- → Sporting Event Attire:
 - ◆ GCS Chorus Polo, Dark blue jeans without rips or holes, Shirts tucked in, and Tennis shoes.
- → Christmas Concert Approved Attire:
 - **♦** Tops:
 - Black top with sleeves
 - Festive Christmas top or sweater
 - Bottoms:
 - Black pants or skirt (no more than 4 inches above the knee)
 - **♦** Accessories:
 - Accessories that are clean, festive, and fun
 - Hats are permitted as long as they do not cover the eyes (no billed hats)
 - Those wearing skirts must also wear black tights
 - Shoes: black dress shoes, black flats, or black character shoes
- → Spring Concert/Choral Performance Assessment Attire:
 - ◆ Men
 - Suit purchased from Street Tux
 - Black dress shoes and Black socks
 - Black dress shirt, Black tie, Black belt
 - If the suit no longer fits, contact Mr. Shockley at least two months before the first spring performance so that adjustments can be made.
 - Women
 - Chantilly outfit
 - Black character shoes
 - Black tights
 - Accessories limited to a pearl necklace and pearl stud earrings
 - Remove all other jewelry, including bracelets, necklaces, smartwatches, and additional piercings
 - Nails must be free of polish or a skin-tone matching color

Please note that hair for all events should be neatly styled or pulled back away from the face.

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 - ◆ Cleanliness and Grooming: Maintain personal hygiene and ensure that your clothing is clean and well-presented. Grooming should be neat and appropriate for the occasion.
 - ◆ Consider the Occasion: Choose attire that aligns with the nature of the event. Dress more formally for special occasions, religious events, or formal gatherings, and dress appropriately for casual outings.

Theatre

→ Rehearsal Attire

◆ Clothing

 All clothing should be modest and respectful. Avoid clothing that is overly revealing, tight-fitting, or excessively casual. Our attire should reflect the seriousness and dignity of the creative process.

- Wear clothing that allows for ease of movement and comfort during rehearsals. This may include leggings, loose-fitting pants, or athletic wear. Ensure that your attire doesn't restrict your ability to perform or participate fully.
- Approved Rehearsal-Wear:
 - Tops: Goodpasture T-Shirt, Solid Black or White T-Shirt, Solid Black or White Tank Top
 - Bottoms: Black Leggings, Black Shorts (at least 5" inseam),
 Black Tennis Skirt (at least 5" inseam), Black Sweatpants, Black
 Rehearsal Skirt (with one of the previous bottoms underneath)
- Students are permitted to wear their GCS school uniform to rehearsals that do not involve movement.
- Tank tops should not show excessive skin or undergarments at the neckline or underarm.
- Spandex shorts are not permitted. Shorts must be loose around the leq.

Footwear

- Closed-toe shoes with appropriate support are essential for safety during rehearsals. Avoid open-toed shoes, sandals, flip-flops, or footwear that hinders movement.
- As soon as possible, actors should wear their show shoes during rehearsal.

◆ Hair

- Hair should be neatly groomed and tied back if necessary to prevent interference with activities.
- If a student has been cast in a show, please consult the director BEFORE altering your hair in any way.

Tattoos and Piercings

 Tattoos must be covered during rehearsals and performances. For piercings, minimal and non-distracting jewelry is allowed, but large or excessive piercings should be removed or replaced for safety during movement.

→ Spotlight Awards

• We celebrate the accomplishments and talents of our students through our participation in the Spotlight Awards, an event hosted by and at the Tennessee Performing Arts Center, where excellence in performance and dedication to the arts are recognized. To maintain an atmosphere of elegance and respect while adhering to our Christian values, we present the following dress code quidelines for red carpet attire:

- Modesty and Elegance: Choose attire that is elegant, tasteful, and aligned with Christian values. Dresses and suits should be of appropriate length and fit, without excessive cleavage, low necklines, or high slits above the mid-thigh.
- **Formality:** Select attire that reflects the formality of the event. Gowns, suits, tuxedos, and cocktail dresses are all appropriate choices. Avoid casual or overly casual clothing.
- **Footwear:** Wear formal shoes that complement your attire. High heels, dress shoes, or formal flats are suitable choices.
- Grooming: Prioritize grooming and hygiene. Hair should be neatly styled, and makeup should be tasteful and in line with the elegance of the event.
- Award Attire for Men: Suits are recommended. A tie or bowtie should be worn, and shoes should be formal.
- Red Carpet Attire for Women: Choose a dress that is elegant and fits well. Floor-length gowns, cocktail dresses, jumpsuits, and pant suits are appropriate choices.
- ◆ If there are specific dress code requirements for the Spotlight Awards, they will be communicated in advance. Please adhere to any guidelines provided by the school administration or event organizers.

Other Out-Of-School Events:

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 - ◆ Appropriate Fit and Length: Select clothing that fits well and is of an appropriate length. Dresses, skirts, and shorts should be of modest length, and pants should not be excessively tight.

- ◆ Necklines and Sleeves: Opt for necklines and sleeves that provide adequate coverage. Avoid low necklines, strapless or spaghetti-strap tops, and sleeveless tops with overly wide armholes.
